SOME THOUGHTS

Humility is a most elusive spiritual gift. The fact is that as soon as a person considers themself to be humble, that person has lost their humility.

We certainly cannot be proud of our humility.

Having said that some people are naturally humble. They have always lived by the management dictum that 'there is no limit to what you can accomplish If no one cares who gets the credit'. Praise and public recognition just does not stick to these people.

Other people have learned the privilege of service and thereby found humility.

For one of the lessons of maturity is the wonder of giving without expecting anything in return.

The joy of humility is found in service, whatever kind it is. Only the humble heart can know and experience this joy. For Christians, the model of Jesus means that we take risks to live out the service we are each called to do. Jesus was publicly humiliated when he was run out of his hometown. He was humbled when his family considered him unstable and tried to pull him back into the fold.

Since the words humiliation and humility come from the same root, we need to ponder the possible connection between the two human experiences. Humiliation is not always necessary to have the gift of humility, but perhaps taking the chance of being humiliated is one form of humility. Chances are that few of us will face the humiliation of a public trial. But even there, Jesus' posture was a humble one. The model is one that only Jesus could achieve. But we are encouraged to follow his example, nonetheless.

Jesus was able to carry out his humble service on the earth because he lived and ministered within a constant sense of the presence of God. Seeking to live our lives in that same place offers us the possibility of the gift of humility. Sometimes life has lessons to teach us through humiliation, but the issue then is whether our heart is willing to listen and learn.

It is not easy to walk humbly on the earth. And yet the great spiritual paradox is that humility is our greatest protection, mostly from ourselves. Otherwise, we may be constantly living in stress and anxiety and the fear of loss of control, something we never had in the first place.

Humility is not poverty, but the wealth of freedom that comes when we release a judging attitude towards others and ourselves.
